DEFINITIONS:

Subject Area and Catalogue Number

A 4-letter subject area code plus a 4-digit catalogue number make up the course code, e.g. **BIOL 1033**. You can search for courses by using this code.

Enrolment Class

An Enrolment Class is the first class you enrol in for a particular course. This can be a lecture (LEC), tutorial (TUT), workshop (WSH), practical (PRA) or external (EXT) to name a few examples. There may be multiple enrolment classes to choose between. All other components will be related to the enrolment class and will display once you select your enrolment class.

Related Classes

Related classes are other components (i.e. a tutorial or practical) that make up the course. In some cases you may be automatically enrolled into a particular related class that is associated with the enrolment class you selected.
