



Studying in Australia: Biosecurity information

DO NOT BRING

To avoid lengthy delays on arrival, DO NOT BRING these items into Australia.



Food

Meat, poultry, seafood, dairy, eggs, home-cooked meals, sandwiches, fruit and vegetables (e.g. chilli, garlic), food from the plane, grains, rice, nuts, seeds, beans and herbs and spices for cooking or medicine.



Plant material

Leaves, seeds, bark, live plants, cuttings, flowers and straw.

DECLARE



Wooden items, animal products (feathers, bone, hair or skins), footwear or equipment with soil on them or that have been used near animals or in rural areas.

You must declare if you are carrying any biosecurity risk goods on your Incoming Passenger Card. If you fail to declare, or provide a false declaration, you can be penalised. This may include being given an infringement notice or having your visa cancelled.

If you have any questions, or are unsure, mark YES on your IPC and a biosecurity officer will assist you.
