

What will we consider supporting?

The Deputy Vice Chancellor: Research and Enterprise (DVCRE) and the Pro Vice Chancellor: Aboriginal Leadership and Strategy (PVC: ALS) will jointly consider applications received in furtherance of Aboriginal Research under the Aboriginal Research Strategy 2019-25; for seed funding of up to \$25,000 per application.

Applications will be assessed against the following criteria:

- High-value, strategic and novel Aboriginal research that benefits First Nations Peoples.
- First Nations community engagement and evidence of Aboriginal leadership and community benefit that enables self-determination for First Nations Peoples.
- Alignment with Aboriginal Elders and Communities' research priorities (i.e., Wellbeing and Mental Health; Food Systems and Security; Ageing Housing and Education; and Preservation and Curation of Aboriginal Cultures, Languages and Knowledge).
- Alignment to the Aboriginal Research Strategy, including the guiding principles, and AIATSIS guidelines.
- Existence of direct links to Category 1 4 Grant Funds with specific interest in ARC, MRFF, CRC, CRCS, Defence Industry Partnership, Indigenous Discover, MRFF and CRCs.
- The extent to which the project provides a basis for building research activity and/or capacity at UniSA (e.g. future funding applications, career development of ECRs and MCRs).
- Innovation, strategic partnerships and potential translation and impact.

Funding Requirements?

- Requests can only be made by UniSA staff:
 - Who will be UniSA employees throughout the duration of the proposed grant, or have adjunct status and whose salary will be met by the grant, and who have a UniSA ORCID ID.
 - Who provide a full list of UniSA staff associated with the application—including adjunct and emeritus staff—and their ORCID IDs.
- Funds awarded in 2024 must be expended in 2024.
- That such funds **cannot** be used for research degree scholarships or stipends.
- Successful applicants(s) to present a final report by Friday 6 December 2023. The report must include a final acquittal that outlines how the funds were used (see Attachment 1).

<u>Please note</u> that grants will be administered on a rolling basis until the fund is exhausted. No more than two projects over five years per applicant may be awarded.

Who can approve my request?

- The application must be endorsed and supported by the relevant Dean of Research
- The DVCRE and the PVC: ALS or delegates will jointly assess the applications
- Any such decision made shall be final and not subject to any review and/or appeal.



How will I know the outcome of my application?

You will receive an email copied to the relevant Dean of Research from Research and Innovation Services (RIS) advising the outcome of your application. This notification will advise of any conditions attached to the award.

What happens if I am successful in the grant application?

- Funds will be transferred from the DVCRE to RIS to manage and report against on behalf of the researcher and their responsible Academic Unit.
- The researcher will be able to draw down on the funds awarded as agreed with RIS.

When and where should I lodge this form?

Unless an exception has been granted by the DVCRE and the PVC ALS, all applications must be received no later than Friday 30 August 2024 to ensure there is a minimum of 3 months research time before reaching the closing and reporting / acquittal date of Friday 6 December 2024.

Please note to avoid any misunderstanding or confusion, that any funds awarded under this scheme must be fully acquitted by Friday 6 December 2024.
