The Preclusion Appeals Committee has considered your appeal against preclusion and has decided **you will be precluded from your program**. The Committee has denied your appeal based on the following:

What happens now?

You may appeal this decision if you believe that either:

- A. Relevant evidence not previously available has become available, or
- B. The policy and procedures for Academic Review were not correctly observed, as per the Assessment Policies and Procedures Manual (APPM).

If you wish to appeal, please complete the Appeal to Student Appeals Committee Against Preclusion by the **Due Date - SAC Appeal**.

APPEAL TO STUDENT APPEALS COMMITTEE

If you choose to appeal, you may continue your studies while your appeal is being considered. The Registrar and Director: Student and Academic Services will consider whether your appeal meets either of the conditions above. If it does, your appeal will be forwarded to the [Student Appeals Committee](#). If it does not, your appeal will not progress.

If your appeal is forwarded to the Student Appeals Committee, the Committee will have access to your Academic Support Plans and any other documentation submitted to the Preclusion Appeals Committee. The decision of the Student Appeals Committee will be final and if your appeal is unsuccessful there are no further avenues of appeal within the University.

What does it mean to be precluded?

If you choose not to appeal, or your appeal is unsuccessful, you will be precluded from your program. This means:

- Your enrolment in your program will be discontinued.
- You will be prevented from studying in this program, or a program in the same discipline, for the next two years.
- Application for re-admission will follow normal procedures and is not guaranteed.

If you are an international student and hold a student visa please note that:

- As a condition of your student visa, you are required to maintain satisfactory academic progress and attendance. This means you must continue your studies while your appeal is being considered.

- The University is obliged to maintain your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) while the appeal is ongoing.
- Preclusion from your program constitutes a breach of your student visa. If you are precluded, the University is required by law to notify the Department of Home Affairs. This results in cancellation of your CoE and may result in the cancellation of your student visa.
