Scholarship Title: SA Pathology Regional Scholarship

Description:

SA Pathology will fund two scholarships to students in the fourth year of the Bachelor of Laboratory Medicine. Scholarships are intended to improve attraction and retention rates of Medical Scientists in diagnostic pathology laboratories in regional South Australia.

Conditions and Criteria

- Available only to full time students in the fourth year of the Bachelor of Laboratory Medicine who are not already scholarship holders.
- Scholarships are only available to students undertaking the Clinical Practice component of the program.
- Scholarships are only available to Australian citizens or permanent residents.
- **Scholarship recipients will be required to take up a 12 month appointment in a regional SA Pathology laboratory as negotiated with the Head, Regional Services (SA Pathology) at the completion of their degree**
- All applicants must submit a scholarship application form (available online), a one page written statement setting out how they would benefit professionally from being awarded a scholarship, two referees reports and provide proof of academic merit. - Applicants will be invited to attend an interview with the selection panel. The interview will be based on the following criteria: demonstrated communication skills; vision for a career in Laboratory Medicine; a commitment to professional involvement; and a capacity to act in an ambassadorial role in furthering the program.
- A scholarship will not be offered if there are no suitable applicants.
