OVERSEAS EXCHANGE & STUDY TOURS

Studying abroad can pave your path to global citizenship. With more than 60 partner universities, you can choose to study in over 20 locations including Europe, UK, Canada, USA, South Korea and Japan. Length of exchange can be anywhere from two weeks to one year. Together with OS-Help loans you may be eligible for up to \$12,500 to assist with expenses overseas.

You will gain the opportunity to experience diverse customs and cultures, build international networks and improve your language and intercultural communication skills. Your global perspective can also enhance your career prospects once you graduate.
