St. Catharines, known as "The Garden City" as it is surrounded by acres of parks, gardens and trails, is framed by Lake Ontario, Lake Erie and the Niagara River. The region is also well known for its vineyards, arts events and of course, as a gateway to Niagara Falls.

SEMESTER LONG PROGRAMS

There are a variety of semester long courses taught in English available in both the Fall and Spring Semesters. Discipline areas covered include:

The Goodman School of Business also offers an MBA program.

What does it cost?

As an exchange partner with the University of South Australia, you do not have to pay tuition fees to the Goodman School of Business at Brock University as these are included as part of your fees at UniSA.

Travel and living expenses are at your own cost. The table below gives an indication of costs you will incur:

ITEM	COST
Return flights - Adelaide to Toronto	\$1500
Return GO train from Toronto to St. Catharines (around 2 hours)	\$40
Bus pass - U-pass	\$100 per month
Accommodation - on-campus	\$850 - \$900 per month
Health insurance	\$230 per semester
Meals	\$320 - \$500 per month
Entertainment and incidentals including phone, laundry etc.	\$400 - \$600 per month

Key dates

- Winter Semester: January - April which corresponds with UniSA Study Period 2. Applications close on August 1.
- Fall Semester: September - December which corresponds with UniSA Study Period 5. Applications close on January 11.

The academic year is divided into two teaching periods, each of approximately 11 weeks.

All exchanges are managed by the study overseas team at UniSA International who will help you apply for your exchange and will contact the partner institution on your behalf.

Entry requirements

- Undergraduate: A minimum of 36 units undertaken at UniSA with a GPA of 4 or above.
- Postgraduate: A minimum of 9 units at Masters level at UniSA with a GPA of 4 or above.
- An internet-based TOEFL score of at least 88 points or equivalent.

Accommodation

On-campus residence is usually available for exchange students who apply early enough. Off-campus housing is available and the Off-Campus Living Office can assist students in finding a suitable place to stay.

Credit information

Brock University courses are given either a 0.5 partial credit or 1.0 full credit with most courses receiving 0.5 credits. Five 0.5 credit courses at Brock University is equivalent to 18 units/4 courses at UniSA. Applicants may undertake a 75% study load on exchange.

Travel information

Australian citizens will require a Study Permit and an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) for study in Canada. All other nationalities should check with their travel agent and provide sufficient time to obtain their Visa prior to travel as it can be a lengthy process.

Travel grant & scholarship information

Minimise your out of pocket travel expenses by applying for one of University's international travel grants. If you are approved for one of our exchange programs you are eligible to apply. Each eligible student can receive up to \$2500 total in travel grants over their student life at UniSA.

Undergraduate students may apply for Australian Government OS-Help loans to assist with their expenses.

Insurances

UniSA provides exchange students with Travel Insurance for study related travel. It is mandatory for all students on exchange in Canada to have health and hospital insurance for the duration of their stay. In addition, all International Students must purchase the University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP), to provide protection compared to that available from the Ontario Government (OHIP).
