## About Toronto

The capital of the province of Ontario in eastern Canada, Toronto is the largest city in Canada and its financial and commercial centre. Located on the northwestern shore of Lake Ontario which forms part of the border with the US. Filled with green spaces and boasting a lively cultural scene, including the famous Toronto Film Festival, it's a city not short of things to do, even in the cold winter season. Linked to New York, via Niagara Falls, by the stunning 12 hour train trip, "The Maple Leaf" or a 90 minute flight it's a perfect base to explore North America from.

## What does it cost?

As an exchange partner with the University of South Australia, you do not have to pay tuition fees at HEC Montréal as these are included as part of your fees at UniSA.

Travel and living expenses are at your own cost. The table below gives an indication of costs you will incur:

ITEM	COST
Return flights - Adelaide to Toronto	\$2000
Buss pass	\$129 per month
Accommodation	\$600 - \$1100 per month
Health insurance	\$215 - for the semester
Meals	\$250 - \$300 per month
Entertainment and incidentals including phone, laundry etc	\$400 - \$600 per month

## Key dates

- Winter Term: January - April which corresponds with UniSA Study Period 2. The closing date for applications is August 1.
- Fall Term: September - December which corresponds with UniSA Study Period 5. The closing date for applications is January 11.

## How to apply

All exchanges are managed by the study overseas team at UniSA International who will help you apply for your exchange and will contact the partner institution on your behalf.

## Entry requirements

- Undergraduate: Completed at least two years of their Business degree.
- Postgraduate: Completed an undergraduate degree in a relevant Business Discipline area or at least the equivalent of 180 ECTS credits in Business studies.
- For non-English speakers, a B2 level Certificate in English or equivalent is required.

## Accommodation

Accommodation is not available on-campus. The Ryerson Housing Department can assist with advice in finding

accommodation including neighbourhoods and information on private rental agreements. It is suggested that you begin your search for accommodation early and secure it prior to your arrival as short-term living arrangements can be difficult to secure.

## Credit information

Exchange students are required to take a minimum of four courses and a maximum of six, depending on the academic program. Credit for one UniSA 4.5 unit subject requires a minimum of 3 units of study. Applicants may undertake a 75% study load on exchange. UniSA recommends that four courses studied at Ryerson are equivalent to 18 UniSA units and 3 courses are equivalent to 13.5 units.

## Travel information

All students travelling to Canada either require a Visa and or an eTA (Electronic Travel Authorisation). Further information will be provided on acceptance in to the program. More information on Canadian Visa requirements, visit the website at <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp>

## Travel grant & scholarship information

Minimise your out of pocket travel expenses by applying for one of the University's international travel grants. If you are approved for one of our exchange programs you are eligible to apply. Each eligible student can receive up to \$2500 total in travel grants over their student life at UniSA.
