Credit information

The standard semester workload is 6O Strathclyde credits, equivalent to 18 UnisA units. Credit for one UniSA 4.5 unit subject requires a minimum of 3.75 Strathclyde credits. Applicants may undertake a 75% study load on exchange.

Travel information

Most non-EEA students attending Strathclyde up to one semester may apply for a short term study visa stamp on arrival at the airport or planned prior to departure but please check your eligibility at http://www.strath.ac.uk/sees/infoint/visasandpbs/

Travel grant & scholarship information

Minimise your out of pocket travel expenses by applying for one of the University's international travel grants. If you are approved for one of our exchange programs you are eligible to apply. Each eligible student can receive up to \$2500 total in travel grants over their student life at UniSA.
