Established in 1919, the triple-crown accredited University of Ljubljana is the oldest and largest higher education institute in Slovenia. Ranked in the top 500 of the world's best universities in the Shanghai, Times and Webometrics rankings it has over 40,000 students, including 2,000 international students, the university has a strong international and sustainability focus.

About Slovenia

Slovenia is a diverse country bordered by Italy, Austria, Croatia and Hungary making it an ideal base for exploring Europe. It's a country of natural beauty with lakes, mountains, caves, rivers and waterfalls to explore and an excellent food and wine culture to enjoy.

Ljubljana, the capital and largest city is home to the University of Ljubljana and has a thriving arts, food and socially conscious scene. It was named the European Green Capital of 2016.

Why should I go on exchange?

JOINT SUMMER SCHOOL - TOULOUSE & LJUBLJANA

The Joint Summer School is hosted by the Toulouse Business School and the University of Ljubljana. Beginning in Toulouse and then travelling (via the scenic route) to Slovenia, students undertake two courses in each city. This six week joint summer school attracts up to 24 ECTS.

What does it cost?

As an exchange partner with the University of South Australia, you do not have to pay fees at University of Ljubljana as these are included as part of your fees at UniSA. Travel and living expenses are at your own cost. The table below gives an indication of costs you will incur:

Return flights - Adelaide to Zagreb	\$1800
Return train from Zagreb to Ljubljana (2.5 hours)	\$150
Accommodation - on-campus	\$140 - \$170 per month
Visa	\$50
Health insurance	Australian residents have access to a Reciprocal Health Care Agreement*
Meals	\$300 - \$550 per month
Entertainment and incidentals including phone, laundry etc.	\$150 - \$200 per month

Key dates

- Winter Semester: October - January which corresponds with UniSA Study Period 5 and over the end of year break. The closing date for applications is January 11.
- Summer Semester: February - June which corresponds with UniSA Study Period 2. The closing date for applications is August 1.
- Summer School: June - July which corresponds with UniSA Study Period 4

All exchanges are managed by the study overseas team at UniSA International who will help you apply for your exchange and will contact the partner institution on your behalf.

Entry requirements

- Undergraduate: Completed at least two years of their Business degree.
- Postgraduate: Completed an undergraduate degree in a relevant Business Discipline area or at least the equivalent of 180 ECTS credits in Business Studies.
- For non-English speakers, a B2 level (IELTS 6) Certificate in English is required.

Accommodation

Students can apply for a bed in student dormitories. If you prefer to live in a private accommodation, the student organization of UL will help you find private accommodation after your arrival. More information can be found on the [website](#).

Credit information

The University of Ljubljana uses the ECTS (European Credit Transfer System). A standard workload is 30 ECTS per semester. Credit for one UniSA 4.5 unit subject requires a minimum of 7.5 ECTS study. Applicants may undertake a 75% study load on exchange.

Travel information

Citizens of virtually all European countries as well as Australia, Canada, Israel, Japan, New Zealand and the USA do not require visas to visit Slovenia for stays of up to 90 days. If required, visas can be acquired at any Slovenian embassy or consulate for up to 90 days. The cost is €35 (around \$50 AUD) regardless of the type or length of validity. Proof of enrolment is required along with a no-objection certificate from the university.

Travel grant & scholarship information

Minimise your out of pocket travel expenses by applying for one of the University's international travel grants. If you are approved for one of our exchange programs you are eligible to apply. Each eligible student can receive up to \$2500 total in travel grants over their student life at UniSA. Undergraduate students may apply for Australian Government OS-Help loans to assist with their expenses.

Insurances

UniSA provides exchange students with Travel Insurance for study related travel. Additionally, it is mandatory for all students on exchange to have private health insurance with full coverage for sickness, emergencies, repatriation sufficient to cover all medical expenses.
